Coalition concept
Developed May 1997, Third Invitational Minority Nursing Congress, "Caring for
the Emerging Majority: A Blueprint for Action" sponsored by the Division of
Nursing, in Denver.

- Presidents of the Asian American Pacific/ Islanders, National Hispanic, National Alaska Native American Indian and National Black Nurse Associations held their own informal meeting to consider the issues, opportunities and advantages of forming a coalition.
- The presidents found that they had mutual concerns and committed to joining forces into a coalition which would enable them to leverage their combined expertise.
